

Update on GED testing

In the past month, GED Testing Service and Texas Education Agency, as well as TCC Trinity River Campus, Dallas ISD Adult Ed, and the Tarrant Literacy Coalition have been working very hard to help as many students as possible take the GED exam before the end of the year. Hundreds of students have taken the exam, and we are so pleased at the response of the students and our community partners.

I was at the test registration again this weekend, and need to remind you of this: if you have any students who are going to be taking the GED in the final days of this year, they must know that a valid government issued ID is required to take the exam. Students must also be able to show Texas residency. So, if a student's ID is from another state, he/she needs to take something that proves he/she lives in Texas, such as a utility bill, pay stub with a local address on it, etc. Also, the government issued photo ID must be current. Expired licenses are not acceptable.

Next Friday and Saturday, GED testing will be happening in Dallas at the former Fannin Elementary School. This will likely be the last large GED testing event scheduled this year. (Two days for retests only are scheduled for the first weekend in December in Dallas.) TCC Trinity River Campus regular GED testing is full for the remainder of the year. TCC South and Weatherford College have very few spaces available. Some testing may still be available in neighboring communities including Cleburne and Waxahachie and we are trying to stay on top of that, so if you have a student who still needs to test in December, please let us know and we will try to help but please do not count on that option. Very limited computer based testing is also available, but again, should only be considered

preparation programs as possible. The meeting will be Thursday, November 7 at 10:30 am, location TBD. If you would like to attend this event please contact
